Statement of Significance: Schools have a special place in the social life of a village, and especially of families within the village, and over almost a century the curtilage and successive buildings of Glenbrook Public School have been a significant local focus. The 1911 building of Glenbrook Public School is a typical example of a local public school building of the early twentieth century. It is unusual in having a WWI Roll of Honour in the enclosed verandah.

The interiors of the 1911 building are intact with representative value and enhance the overall significance of the building.

The 1915 portable timber building is representative of timber building construction of the time, and is similar in detailing to the school building at the Blackheath Public School site. The building is likely relocated from another site. Although the exterior has been modified, the interior has a simple but fine raked ceiling and roof structure. The horizontal corner brackets may be a modification related to its relocation. It retains the original timber joinery including windows and doors and internal linings.

Historical Notes or Provenance: Part of the public recreation reserve since 1884, this has been the site of Glenbrook Public School since 1903. The original wooden building of 1892 had been erected in the north-east corner of Glenbrook Park and was moved to the present school site in 1903. It was then supplemented in 1911 by the surviving brick building, which was extended in 1936-7 when the 1892 schoolroom was demolished. The two wooden classrooms on the south of the site were brought from elsewhere in the 1950s. Pressure on the site was relieved by the building of the new primary school some distance away in 1961. The whole surviving area of the present Infants School has some heritage significance. The 1911 building is a good

Physical Description: Glenbrook Public School (Infants' department) is a group of gabled brick and weatherboard buildings loosely arranged on the north, west and south sides of a central courtyard. The earliest of the buildings on the site is the 1911 school building near the northeast corner.

The interiors of the three heritage buildings on the site were inspected for the Heritage Review 2016-2017. The inspection was visual only, there was no opening up.

1911 Building (B00A)

A gabled brick building with a verandah to the east and south, now enclosed with brickwork. The building has 9 over 9 pane double hung windows in the north wall. The gabled roof is on the north-south axis.

With the enclosure of the verandah, an entry porch with a gabled roof has been added on the south side. The gable over the entry porch has been clad with shingles.

The roof of the building is corrugated steel.

The building was extended to the west in 1936-7 when the verandahs were enclosed and the porch built.

A fine polished timber Roll of Honour from WWI is located on the south wall of the original building.

The interiors of the 1911 building are intact. There are two classrooms with ancillary rooms, with likely floorboards under the carpet. Some of the ceilings are timber lining boards, the walls are rendered with a dado moulding, and there is timber joinery such as door architraves, 4-panelled door leafs, skirtings, window sills and picture rails. There are corner fireplaces, one with a terrazzo mantel and moulded surrounds, the other with a timber mantel. There are original built-in cupboards. The enclosed verandahs have timber lined ceilings, timber floorboards and face brickwork, with later style timber panelled door leafs

Timber Buildings

A pair of gabled timber classrooms, with enclosed verandahs on their north sides, are located on the south side of the site. The buildings appear to be portable classrooms, which were relocated to the site c.1950s.

Building B00E is now used by the local historical society. The front verandah has been infilled with weatherboard cladding and a mixture of aluminium windows and modern timber doors. The roof extends in one plane over the verandah. The interiors are intact but very modest, with walls and ceiling of fibro and batten in reasonable condition. The building appears to date from the 1950s.

Building B00F is now used by Nordoff Robbins. The interiors are quite impressive for a small modest building, with a high timber lined ceiling with raked sides and corner timber bracing and metal cross ties. The walls are fibro and batten with a slightly decorative configuration. The original windows remain to the south and are three large double-hung timber sash windows. The verandah has been enclosed but contains a further single original double-hung timber sash window and the original ledged and sheeted timber door with fanlight, both of Victorian era and style. A new door is located in the wall, likely replacing a similar window to the others. The floor is likely to be floorboards but is carpeted. The building appears to date from c.1915.

West Buildings

Gabled brick buildings, with east verandahs enclose the courtyard to the west of the site.

Physical Condition: Good

Modification Dates: See History

Recommended Management: Conserve 1911 school building, including early additions and WWI Roll of Honour. The whole area containing the Infants School should be assessed as a cultural whole with heritage values including vegetation, open space, all the school buildings and its physical relationship to the rest of the core village.

Original internal fabric should be retained in any future development. This includes timber floorboards, timber ceiling lining boards, wall surfaces, timber joinery such as door leafs and architraves, fibro and batten ceilings, fireplaces including chimney breasts, mantels, grates and hearths, and built-in timber furniture.

Further original internal fabric may be concealed beneath more recent layers. At the time of any new work or refurbishment, care should be taken during any demolition to ensure possible original or early layers or evidence that is currently concealed is not damaged or removed. If original material is uncovered it may be worthy of investigation, retention, protection and/or conservation. This is dependent upon the significance and condition of the fabric. An opportunity should be taken to record any early evidence and/or provide interpretation if retention is not possible, with records such as photos/notes (hard copy or digital) informally submitted to Council to the attention of Council's heritage advisor.
