

CROSSING OF THE MOUNTAINS 1813

COX'S ROAD 1814 FLOODED CREEK PROBLEM

OLD BATHURST ROAD OR LAWSON'S ROAD 1824 STEEP

MAJOR MITCHELL.... MITCHELL' PASS RESULTED FROM THE LAYOUT OF THE TOWNSHIP OF EMU AND THE SIGHTING OF A CLEAR PASS THROUGH WHICH A NEW ROAD MAY BE MADE

WORK BEGAN IN 1832 AT THIS POINT DAVID LENNOX CAME INTO THE PICTURE

DAVID LENNOX HAD BEEN BORN, TRAINED AND WORKED IN SCOTLAND AS A MASTER STONEMASON. HE WAS ASSOCIATED WITH THE FAMOUS BRIDGEBUILDER THOMAS TELFORD.

AFFECTED BY UNEMPLOYMENT IN 1828 HE MIGRATED TO THE COLONY IN EARLY 1832 AND WAS WORKING ON THE STONE WALL IN FRONT OF THE PARLIAMENT HOUSE IN MACQUARIE STREET WHEN HIS WORK WAS NOTICED BY MAJOR MITCHELL.

INTRODUCED TO THE GOVERNOR HIS CREDENTIALS WERE CHECKED AND HE WAS APPOINTED FIRSTLY A SUB INSPECTOR OF ROADS AND SHORTLY AFTERWARDS THE SUPERINTENDENT OF BRIDGES. HE STARTED WORK ON THIS BRIDGE IN NOVEMBER 1832 WITH A FORCE OF 20 CONVICTS AND COMPLETED IT IN JULY 1833.

THE QUARRY FROM WHICH THE STONE WAS OBTAINED IS LOCATED ABOUT 400 METRES UPSTREAM FROM THE BRIDGE.

THE BRIDGE IS A SEMI CIRCULAR STONE ARCH TEN METRES RADIUS 30 FEET HIGH. IT HAS A CURVED FRONT WALL TO ACCOUNT FOR THE BEND IN THE ROAD AND BECAUSE OF THIS WAS SOMETIMES CALLED THE HORSESHOE BRIDGE.

CARRYING ALL WESTWARD TRAFFIC UNTIL 1926 UNTIL THE GREAT WESTERN HIGHWAY DEVIATION IT REMAINED OPEN UNTIL 1964 WHEN SERIOUS CRACKING CAUSED THE COUNCIL TO CLOSE IT. IT IS THE OLDEST MAINLAND

Main ridge finally chosen. Whitton had several options for Lapstone monodine incld tunneling through Glenbrook Gorge (today's route). Had to settle for Zig Zag option (cheaper).</p> <p><b>1864</b> Knap sack Bridge built (by William Watkins)</p> <p><b>1867</b> Zig Zag completed</p> <p><b>1892</b> Single lane tunnel built (now mushroom farm). Zig Zag disused.</p> <p><b>1910</b> Lithgow Zig Zag superseded.</p> <p><b>1913</b> Dual railway through Glenbrook Gorge constructed.</p> <p><b>1926</b> Knap sack Viaduct used as Highway</p> <p><b>1938</b> Knap sack Viaduct widened</p>	<p>Knap sack Viaduct (sandstone bridge)</p> <p>Lapstone Zig Zag</p> <p>Tunnel Gully (2<sup>nd</sup> rail route up Lapstone Monocline)</p> <p>Skarrat Park (site of Zig Zag sidings &amp; 2<sup>nd</sup> rail)</p> <p>Lennox Bridge (on Mitchell's pass road)</p> <p>Darks Common, Lapstone (used for Glenbrook Gorge rail construction)</p> <p>Pilgrims Inn (located at road junctions, Bixnd. #### HISTORY OF THE BRIDGE

Commenced late 1832 and completed July, 1883.

Designed and supervised by famous Scottish Stonemason/Bridge Builder,

David Lennox. Small convict labour force. Materials obtained

locally. Serviced the Mountains for over one hundred years.

Oldest remaining bridge on the mainland.

#### RESTORATION

Bridge closed a number of years ago to carry out repairs which has been possible due to financial input from Council, Federal and State Government grants and Heritage Council of N.S.W. Re-opening, benefit to local residents. Also tourist attraction.
