
Creek Inhabitants

During the early 1940's the war years, a young man who called himself "Tarzan" built a cave dwelling on the north side of the old Blue Pool Track.

He would come to Glenbrook from the city each weekend and spend time in his cave. he would catch silver perch in Glenbrook Creek and yabbies in the side creek which emptied into the Blue Pool, which had no pollution in those days.

He would spend time carving images of faces of jungle animals on the rocks bordering Glenbrook Creek. His most impressive effort was the lion's head carved on the western face of the locally named 'shark's fin rock'.
